







Fighting Malnutrition with Science in Guatemala

(Guatemala City, December 5) Researchers from the Instituto de Agricultura, Recursos Naturales y Ambiente at the Universidad Rafael Landivar (URL IARNA) together with counterparts at McGill University in Canada and at the Inter American Institute for Cooperation on Agriculture (IICA) have received \$450,000 for a three year, Canadian funded project to address food and nutrition insecurity in Guatemala.
